3B. Project Description

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

The Housing Commission of Anne Arundel County (HCAAC) operates the Permanent Supportive Housing Program (SHP I) for homeless families and individuals living with disabilities, targeting the chronically homeless. The program provides rental assistance and case management services to homeless families and individuals living with disabilities from Anne Arundel County. All households served are homeless, from a shelter or were residing on the streets at the time of application into the program. The program gives priority to chronically homeless individual and families when new beds become available due to turnover. Participants receive housing search assistance and case management services. All participants are now referred to the program from the County's by-name, vulnerability list, and housing is targeted to those who score the highest and are most in need and are chronically homeless.

The HCAAC utilizes a housing first model of care, a HUD recognized best practice, in the operation of the SHP I program. As of November 2013, HCAAC participates in the Anne Arundel County's CoC's coordinated assessment and receives referrals through this process. Specifically, the County's CoC – through the Department of Social Services Homeless Coordinator - maintains a list of all homeless individuals and families prioritized through a vulnerability index (VI-SPDAT generated) and utilized as part as County's Coordinated Intake Process. The program accepts the next highest priority or most chronically homeless, vulnerable individual from the list as long as that individual meets all the requirements of the original grant application. This program is open to all sub-populations.

This letter is to inform you that the Arundel House of Hope's Medical Clinic will provide Housing Commission of Anne Arundel County residents in the SHPI Program with health services through the House of Hope Medical Clinic. These support services may include general healthcare, mental health care, prescription assistance and other health related services. The value of these services is estimated at \$10,000 per year at \$1,000 per person for 10 people.

The Arundel House of Community Resource and Day Center will provide the 10 households with additional support services, including housing assistance, employment assistance, counseling services, health and other homeless services. The value of these services is estimated at \$10,000 per year at \$1,000 per person for 10 people.

Arundel House of Hope's Community Recovery Center (CRC) will provide the 10 households additional substance abuse and recovery support services, including recovery and peer support counseling services, and other recovery support activities. The value of these services is estimated at \$15,000 per year at \$1,500 per person for 10 people.
