Disproportionately Impacted Areas (DIAs)



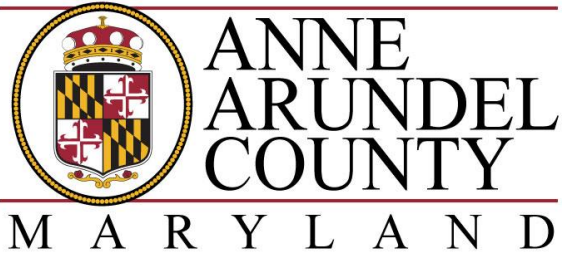

Community Reinvestment & Repair Commission (CRRC) Grant

Grants from the CRRC are funded by the revenue collected from recreational cannabis sales tax in Anne Arundel County which is allocated to the **Community Reinvestment and Repair Fund**.

These grants are for community-based initiatives intended to benefit low-income communities in **Disproportionately Impacted Areas** (DIAs). These DIAs are defined as those that had a cannabis possession charge rate above 150% of Maryland's 10-year average.

Projects and programs operating within the following eight zip codes are eligible to receive funding from the CRRC grants:
21060, 21061, 21113, 21122, 21144, 21225, 21401, and 21403.



Funds will be administered by the CRRC to a variety of programs and initiatives aimed at addressing issues such as homelessness, housing and community development, among others.

Anticipated to be available mid-January 2025 and anticipated application deadline is mid-February.

Video Lottery Terminal Grants

Video Lottery Terminal (VLT) Grants, which are reviewed by the Local Development Council (LDC), are for nonprofit and community organizations serving the communities and residents within a **three-mile radius** of Live! Casino at Arundel Mills.

Some identified goals of the LDC include:

- Human services for success
- Beautifying and revitalizing communities
- Enhancing educational outcomes

Two types of grants are available:

Community grants are available on a competitive basis to nonprofit organizations and community associations serving those residing within the three-mile radius of the Live! Casino and can be awarded for **up to \$40,000**.

Invitation-only grants allow the LDC to invite nonprofit organizations and community associations to apply for funding outside of the \$40,000 Community Grant process in order to meet an identified need or LDC priority.

Laurel Race Course Impact Fund Grants

Laurel Race Course Impact Fund (LRCIF) Grants are for nonprofit and community organizations to provide services and facilities that benefit communities **within three miles of the Laurel Race Course**. Grant applications are reviewed by the LRCIF Advisory Board.

Eligible applicants may apply for grants of \$10,000 – \$50,000. Larger grants may be approved for other projects on a case-by-case basis and selected projects may be funded in part or in whole.

Community Support Grants

An initiative of the County Executive, Community Support Grants (CSG) are for **nonprofit and community organizations to increase their impact and operate more efficiently and effectively to improve and enrich** the lives of Anne Arundel County residents and communities. Programs and projects that are encouraged to apply are those that allow nonprofit organizations to continue to operate and/or increase the impact of an existing program/project, or to pilot a new program to improve and enrich the lives of **Anne Arundel County residents and communities.**

Costs may include, but are not limited to, program/project specific staff costs, supplies, travel, equipment, etc., as well as a percentage of administrative overhead proportional to your program/project's budget relative to your organization's operating budget.

The County Executive and a review team consisting of Health and Human Services leaders will prioritize FY 2026 CSG proposals that include support for programming and initiatives in Anne Arundel County that focus on at least one of the following:

- providing services to underserved populations
- addressing the health and well-being of communities
- promoting equity and inclusion
- eliminating the opportunity gap in education

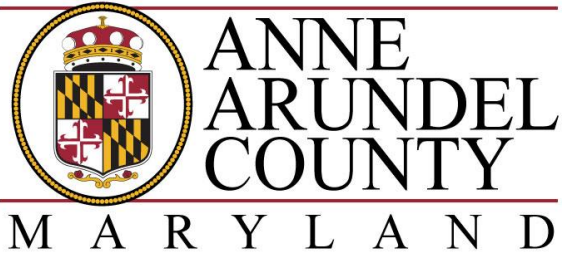

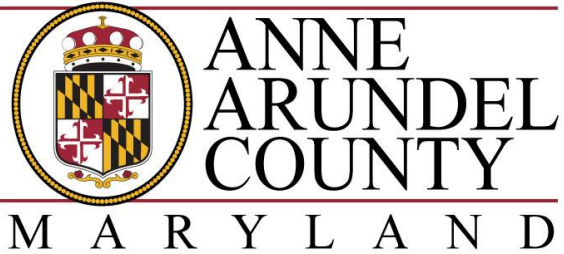
