LARS Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funded PSH program is nearly 10 years old. This year we have a \$1.3million grant from HUD through the Prince George's County Continuum of Care (CoC) that will allow us to expand our program from 34 to 66 households. LARS effectively utilizes federal funds to house chronically homeless households and individuals as well as provide intensive case management and supportive services to keep our clients stably housed. Our annual APR reports demonstrate no errors in management and execution of the program. HUD regularly monitors and audits our programs including an audit completed in 2023 that had no findings of misspent funds or underperformance of activities. For the past three years LARS has had the number 1 rated housing program in the Prince George's County CoC.

## 2. Describe your organization's (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) experience in leveraging Federal, State, local and private sector funds.

In FY24 LARS had over \$850,000 in federal grants, \$35,000 in state grants, \$400,000 in county grans, and \$550,000 in local grants or grants from private foundations. LARS had \$1.2million in unrestricted donations and fundraising and approximately \$250,000 of in kind contributions of food, school supplies, and holiday program gifts. This braiding and leveraging of other grants and donations provides the personnel and physical infrastructure for all of our programs - including the PSH program.

Management Structure and Internal Coordination: LARS employs 14 full-time and four part-time staff and welcomes 205 volunteers. The LARS management team has extensive background in service to nonprofits and to underserved and homeless communities. The roles and qualifications of each senior manager are as follows:

•Shannon Mouton, Executive Director, has more than 30 years of service with charitable organizations. Since joining LARS in 2022, she exceeded fund-raising goals, expanded all LARS programs, increased community partnerships and outreach, and grew the LARS team from 8 to 19 persons. She spearheaded efforts to expand LARS homeless services, launching the Transitional Housing Program, and led efforts to earn a HUD expansion grant for the Permanent Supportive Housing program.

Since becoming a missionary at her church more than three decades ago, Shannon has supported various organizations throughout the DC, Maryland, Virginia (DMV) area – Whitman-Walker Institute, Food & Friends, Calvary Women's Services, and the Potter's House – and made two medical mission trips to Kingston, Jamaica. Shannon holds a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree from Mount Vernon College, now part of The George Washington University.

•Mark Huffman, Director of Client Services, joined LARS in July 2020 and served for six months as acting Executive Director in FY22. Mark has more than three decades of service and leadership to nonprofits and faith-based congregations. Mark provides direction to LARS programs and oversees all client services. He also develops and maintains local, state, and federal funding sources. PSH is designed to provide housing and supportive services to help each client address the issues that contributed to their homelessness. Comprehensive case management is the primary means of delivery of program services. A PSH Case Manager is assigned to each individual or family unit and is responsible for providing an assessment of needs, formulation, and implementation of a Goal & Action Plan (GAP), and other supportive services.

The PSH Case Manager is an integral component in keeping clients housed. They are expected to develop and maintain knowledge of community resources and assist clients with obtaining access to appropriate resources. The PSH Case Manager will make referrals to services that specifically assist clients with meeting their goals and will attempt to refer a client to a service whenever possible. The PSH Case Manager and the client will develop short- and longterm goals with measurable action steps. The PSH Case Manager will make regular contact with clients, at a minimum bi-weekly, to discuss progress and determine how the PSH Case Manager can assist the client with achieving their goals. While LARS has received feedback that demonstrates providing intensive case management, supportive services, life skills training and assistance, and referrals to help clients achieve their goals and move towards independence are extremely important for supporting a client's success, they do not require participation as a condition of remaining housed. LARS' goal is to guide people who have experienced homelessness toward stable, productive lives. Once housed, we connect or reconnect clients to wellness, medical and mental health services, often after they have been untreated for years. We engage community partners for life skills training, education, job development and specialized counseling.

LARS assists transitioning clients in enrolling in GED or job training programs most obtain full-time employment, and many move on to work or advocate for nonprofit organizations. Most formerly homeless clients will see improvements in physical and mental health, substance abuse recovery, employment and/or educational status, and social and family connections. Our experience and expectations are supported by research findings from HUD, US Interagency Council on Homelessness, and the National Alliance to End Homelessness.

LARS has a wide , deep and tested network of partners to refer clients to for mental health, physical health, employment, education, and other life skills needs. LARS currently has an MOU with Hope for All which assist with clothing and furniture supports for clients in our programs. LARS has an MOU with Freestate Justice which is a statewide advocacy group which provides supports and services with the LGBTQIA+ community. LARS has an MOU with Maryland Legal Aid to assist with providing legal services and supports to clients with civil needs. LARS is working to develop a relationship with Accessible Resources for Independence to help provide clients with supports and skills for developing and maintaining independent living. LARS is able to refer clients to mental health service providers, substance abuse providers, workforce development programs, benefit navigation programs, and specialized services for survivors because of these partnerships. In house, LARS is able to offer transportation assistance, medical bill assistance, education and employment assistance, childcare assistance, and life skill classes among other services to have a holistic approach to meeting each client's individual needs to best support their ability to remain in housing.

#### VAWA Budget

In FY2024, the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) has clarified the use of CoC Program funds for VAWA eligible cost categories. - Moving Costs. Assistance with reasonable moving costs to move survivors for an emergency transfer(s).

- Travel Costs. Assistance with reasonable travel costs for survivors and their families to travel for an emergency transfer(s). This may include travel costs to locations outside of your CoC's geography.

- Security Deposits. Grant funds can be used to pay for security deposits of the safe unit the survivor is transferring to via an emergency transfer(s).

- Utilities. Grant funds can be used to pay for costs of establishing utility assistance in the safe unit the survivor is transferring to.

- Housing Fees. Grant funds can be used to pay fees associated with getting survivors into a safe unit via emergency transfer(s), including but not limited to application fees, broker fees, holding fees, trash fees, pet fees where the person believes they need their pet to be safe, etc.

- Case Management. Grant funds can be used to pay staff time necessary to assess, coordinate, and implement emergency transfer(s).

- Housing Navigation. Grant funds can be used to pay staff time necessary to identify safe units and facilitate moves into housing for survivors through emergency transfer(s).

- Technology to make an available unit safe. Grant funds can be used to pay for technology that the individual believes is needed to make the unit safe, including but not limited to doorbell cameras, security systems, phone, and internet service when necessary to support security systems for the unit, etc.

B. VAWA Confidentiality Requirements.Examples of eligible costs for ensuring compliance with VAWA confidentiality requirements include:

- Monitoring and evaluating compliance.

- Developing and implementing strategies for corrective actions and remedies to ensure compliance.

- Program evaluation of confidentiality policies, practices, and procedures.

- Training on compliance with VAWA confidentiality requirements.

- Reporting to CoC Collaborative Applicant, HUD, and other interested parties on compliance with VAWA confidentiality requirements.

- Costs for establishing methodology to protect survivor information.

- Staff time associated with maintaining adherence to VAWA confidentiality requirements.
